


Les Enfants Terribles. The Fantastical Flying Exploratory Laboratory FWB SS

Three Bees' The Human Hive P FWB





Opening Times

Car Parks 12 noon on Friday 9am on Saturday & Sunday.

Festival Site 2pm on Friday. All day Saturday & Sunday.

High Seas area will close at 10pm and re-open at 8am. Please do not venture into this area of site outside of these times. We have lifeguards in place as there is open water in this area.

Workshop Bookings

Most activities do not need to be booked, just turn up at the start or drop in, depending on what it is. A few workshops do need to be booked, this is specified in the programme. Unless the programme asks you to book at a specific place, to book a workshop you need to go to the area where the workshop is being held and book with our lovely area stewards. You can book from 9am for morning sessions and 12pm for afternoon sessions each day.

First Aid

Trained paramedics and first aiders are available on site day and night at our first aid point in the Information Tent at the main entrance. In an emergency please alert one of the festival stewards or security who will radio for assistance or make your way to the First Aid point Information Tent at the entrance.

Lost Children

Grown-ups please ensure you have written your mobile phone number on your child's wristband. There is good mobile phone coverage on site and we will call you if you get separated. Please keep your phone charged - there is a charging point at the information tent. Trained staff from School in the Woods will be on hand to care for any lost children until they are reunited with their grown up. Take your children to say hello to them in Head over Heels so you all know where it is.

Please note that as a family festival children remain the responsibility of parents at all times.

The Best Street Food & Great Bars

We've got hot dogs, pulled pork, fish & chips, paella, pizza, falafels, pies, pasta, burgers, fresh coffee, ice cream and crepes in the Social. On the Village Green & Jitterbug we have coffee, fruit lollies, corn on the cob and snacks; and at the High Seas, sandwiches, salads, pizzas, veggie & vegan grub, coffee, ice cream and snacks.

There is a variety of vegetarian and gluten free options and most stalls offer children's portions.

The marvellous Hoban & Sons will be on hand ready to quench your thirst - in the Social, next to Jitterbug and down at the High Seas.

Phone Charging

A phone charging service is available at the Information tent at the entrance, please bring your own charger with you. We ask for a small donation for this service.

Merchandise

If you haven't already ordered your festival t-shirt or hoody then head to the merchandise stall in Head over Heels.

Alcohol & Smoking

You can bring alcohol into the campsites but not onto the festival site. Our bars operate a Challenge 25 policy. Please remember that the smoking ban applies to all buildings and marquees.

If you've forgotten your tent pegs or other camping essentials, need some bread or milk, we have an essentials shop by the information tent.

Accessibility

We're committed to ensuring a more accessible and enjoyable experience for disabled festival goers and those with specific requirements or additional needs. We are working closely with Attitude is Everything to make this possible. Please let us know at the information tent if you are experiencing difficulties, we will do our utmost to help.

Accessible toilets and showers are marked on the map.

There is a charging point for wheelchair batteries and other access equipment available 24hrs at the first aid point in Grand Central as well as a lockable fridge to store medicines - please ask a member of the first aid team.

If a moment of quiet away from the hustle and bustle is required then you can head to Cheshire Space who have a tent on site, it also has a changing area for children or young people with additional needs.

A hearing loop system is in place in the information tent and at wristband exchange.

We have an access manager who is available to help pre-event and on site. If you have any queries about accessibility drop him a line to callum.hogg@wildrumpus.org.uk. On site, ask at the informtion tent for Callum.

Cash

Please note that many stalls, including the bar and merchandise stall, operate on a cash only basis. We have ATM's on site in Head over Heels, so there should be no need to carry large amounts of cash around site. Be aware there is a small charge to use them.

Site & Sustainability

We love the Rode Hall Estate and aim to leave no trace after the festival. This is especially important as livestock graze on the parkland - help us to achieve this by putting litter in the bins and ensure that you leave your camping pitch completely clear (especially those sneaky tent pegs). Do not wander into areas marked 'No Entry' and try not to disturb wildlife. There are water points on site, marked on your map, please refill your water bottle. Do not drink directly from the taps and do not use stand pipes for washing up pots and pans, use the sinks provided.

There are recycling bins around site and in the campsite, please use them. We are incredibly proud to say that last year nothing went to landfill from the festival site, any residual waste that could not be recycled or composted was turned into biofuel.

No glass is allowed on site.

Please respect your neighbours and keep any noise in the campsites to a minimum.

Lost Property

Any lost property will be handed into the information tent. Please report anything missing there and go there to check and see if items have been handed in.
